#YouSaid - What matters to you

Below are our beat priorities -

Priority:

Dealing with the anti-social behaviour involving the illegal use of e-scooters and off-road bikes across the ward.

Update:

We continue to target antisocial behaviour connected to e-scooters. Following the successes of previous Op Pedalfast events, further are planned where resourcing allows. This period we have been working hard with partners across the neighbourhood Policing area to identify a spree offender making use of an illegal e-scooter to carry of acquisitive offences.

Priority:

Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

Update:

In March we continued to keep the pressure on those who seek to distribute drugs on the Fosse, with the discovery of two cannabis grows, one on Henton Road which led to the seizure of 147 plants, and a smaller 57 plant grow of the class B controlled drug discovered on Hawthorne Street this week, following excellent proactive Policing from the team. More work to target the supply of class A drugs is in the planning stages.

Priority:

Targeting those on the ward who commit anti-social behaviour, particularly where this is connected to drinking or drug use in public. This includes in open spaces such as The Rally, Glenfield Road East and Hinckley Road near the junction with Kirby Road.

Update:

We have been conducting additional patrols of The Rally and Glenfield Road East this month, particularly around the end of the school term. There were concerns raised nationally regarding the possibility of violence connected with a viral trend, so we conducted intensive hi visibility patrols to deter any issues. Thankfully, no violence materialised. Work is ongoing this week with partners to improve the situation on Glenfield Road East connected to street drinking and drug relating ASB. We are also supporting a funding bid for improved CCTV on The Rally, and will be out with partners on a patch walk on the park in the coming month to assess the issues and discuss possible solutions.

Welcome to the March edition of the Fosse Neighbourhood Team Newsletter.

This month there have been a few abstractions due to training courses, so below are some of the main incidents we have been dealing with.

Hinckley Road shops. This can be an area where persons like to congregate and consume alcohol. There is an ASB report currently open for this that Leicester City Council are taking lead and we are supporting. We as a beat are hopeful that the council will be able to put a PSPO in place around the area, giving us more powers to seize alcohol from people who shouldn't be drinking in a PSPO area and to move them along. Until this hopefully happens, we regularly patrol and keep an eye on the area, speaking to those seen and if causing an issue, move on. We're aware with the nicer weather slowly approaching this might become more frequent so we will definitely be in the area more when we can.

West Leicester's Youth Engagement Officer Jo Burton had a meeting at Inglehurst school recently, and they mentioned the bad parking outside and persons parking on zig zags at times they aren't suppose to. We have been trying to patrol this, as well as the other schools when we can, speaking to people and moving on those who are parked where they aren't suppose to be.

March has also seen a couple of cannabis grows found and seized by police, something the Fosse beat team are well aware of. We continue to monitor this, speaking to residents and urging people to contact us if they have any concerns.

Lastly, there has been a spike in theft from vehicles. Suspects have been going around gaining entry into vehicles and taking wallets. This is happening across the whole area, and bank cards are being used in the local shops and garages. Therefore my plea is to not leave valuables in your car, double check you've locked your vehicle and check it when you can to make sure all is ok.

We have a number of PC's investigating this, piecing the puzzle together to find this male so it's only a matter of time he'll be caught.

There hasn't been many reports recently of youths causing ASB which is great news! We are out on the parks often so hopefully this has been a deterrent. It's been lovely to see so many families enjoying the nicer weather and our open spaces too!
